# **Environmental Justice Element May 16, 2023 Workshop Summary**

#### Introduction

In 2018, the City of Commerce ("City") launched efforts to update its General Plan, which establishes a framework for making land-use decisions that affect the quality of life in Commerce. One of the General Plan elements (chapters) focuses on Environmental Justice. Environmental justice, defined by the State of California, is "the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of people of all races, cultures, incomes, and national origins, with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies." The May 16, 2023 workshop was held at the City of Commerce Senior Center, 2555 Commerce Way. The workshop was facilitated by urban planning consultants, MIG, and City staff. The workshop included a presentation and workshop activities.

The Environmental Justice workshop was advertised using both "high tech and high touch" methods. The workshop was advertised on the City's website and electronic flyers (English and Spanish) were directly emailed to a focus group list of 22 people/organizations. Printed flyers (English and Spanish) were distributed throughout Commerce (City Hall, recreation centers/parks, and other locations) and provided to the local schools for distribution. The workshop was attended by approximately 20 community members, of which 12 "signed in" at the Welcome Table.

The Environmental Justice Element is a section of the General Plan that aims to identify and reduce unique or compound health risks in the city with a focus on disadvantaged communities. A disadvantaged community is a designated census tract that has a significantly high risk of exposure to pollution in the air, water, and soil. These tracts also may also experience socioeconomic burdens such as adverse health issues, low incomes, and language barriers.

## **Workshop Presentation and Activity**

The Environmental Justice workshop purpose had two primary purposes -- inform community members regarding the Environmental Justice issues, and collect participant input regarding local pollution and socio-economic burdens. Specifically, the workshop discussed park access and active living; healthy food access; increasing walking, biking, and transit use; urban greening; community services; and governance. After a short presentation, workshop participants visited five stations to express their opinion. Each station contained two displays -- one that discussed the environmental or socio-economic limitations or barriers, and another that identified key strategies to address these limitations.









City staff and MIG planners facilitated each workshop stations' activities and discussion. Participants were asked to rate their responses between 1 and 5 and place a sticker on the display/board to reflect their rating. The display/boards along with participant responses are shown in this summary's Appendix. After the workshop activities, the attendees reconvened to review key input and briefly discuss the General Plan Update's next steps.

## **Workshop Outcomes**

The workshop activity, which primarily focused on pressing challenges throughout the city, provided key insight on the priorities of residents and employees. Overall, there is a strong concern with participants when it comes to having safe and proper access to parks and grocery stores, as well as reducing exposure to pollution. Participants find it difficult to easily travel to a grocery store by walking, biking, or bus. Other priorities included improving the city's workforce development services and expanding childcare facilities.
